Dear Senators Brown and Kerry, and Congressmen Delahunt and Lynch:

Enclosed is my letter of yesterday to U.S. Attorney Carmen Ortiz, asking her to re-investigate the Alfred Trenkler case, and to ask for a three-hour meeting with her and/or delegates to discuss the case.

Also enclosed is a copy of Senator Arlen Specter's 17 December 2009 letter to the Dept. of Justice asking for an investigation into "Mr. Trenkler's innocence claim." In forwarding this

correspondence, I'm joining Alfred Trenkler's previous letters to you asking for a re-investigation.

Please, as Alfred Trenkler's Senators and Congressmen, join together in asking Attorney General Eric Holder for such a re-investigation, or, as Senator Specter put it, an investigation into Alfred Trenkler's "innocence claim." As my letter to Ms. Ortiz indicates, a re-investigation could start with answering a few short yes/no questions. It would take only a few hours for investigators to answer most of those 30 questions.

A request from you to the Dept. of Justice is appropriate because Attorney General Holder is also responsible for the Bureau of Prisons which transferred Alfred Trenkler last winter from Devens to Tucson, Arizona. His calibration of his pacemaker, usually conducted at the U.Mass Medical Center, was scheduled for December, but that appointment was missed and he has had no medical attention for his pacemaker since last year. The Tucson prison is simply not one of the five Bureau of Prison FMC's (Federal Medical Centers). Answering the question of why he was transferred there is not nearly as important as getting him medical care for his pacemaker. This situation is life-threatening.

Finally, Alfred Trenkler is a "perfectly innocent" man. It is nearly impossible to convey to you the enormity of the tragedy of his wrongful imprisonment, and the failure to provide closure to the victims' families. My 727 page manuscript, "Perfectly Innocent" explained the case, and four out of the four jurors who read it wrote to Judge Zobel to disavow their verdicts. That's 100%. A fifth juror similarly wrote to the judge after reading the *Boston Globe* article about the initial juror letters. Several officers in the Boston Police Dept. read the manuscript, and they found no errors. They launched a re-investigation, and met with Jeremiah Hurley's widow and family, and informed Francis Foley. However, that re-investigation has stalled, apparently because of lack of support from the Office of the U.S. Attorney. To my knowledge, no one in the Dept. of Justice has read the manuscript, and certainly no one has contacted me to advise of any errors. Not one single error.

Please, please ask the Dept. of Justice to re-investigate this case and immediately provide appropriate medical care to Alfred Trenkler.
