At this time Paul Rogers checked the apartment and found that the rear kitchen door had been forced open with some type of jimmy bar. Paul Rogers states that to the best of his knowledge the rear outside door was locked when he went to

Reporting officer and Rogers checked the basement and found no sign of entry so unless the rear door was opened during the day the only way of entry was down from the second floor apartment into the rear hallway. Nothing was found to be printable in the Rogers home. A partial list of stolen property is;

1. A plastic bag with twenty dollars in Pennies
2. A twenty five dollar gift certificate to Filenes
3. A Womens 10 K - Gold -Garnet ring -square shaped- with the initials M.P.L.-to-M.J.H-1940 on the inside.
4. ~~A Womens Gold necklace -14K- 16" chain with a round 1/2 K Diamond.~~ *found*
5. Aquinas Junior College Ring- Blue Stone- initials C.F.H.-1969 *Rever*
6. ~~one pair of Diamond Stud earrings - 1/3 K Diamond- 14K Gold stud.~~ *found*
7. A Mans Black Onyx ring with a Diamond chip- chip was loose.

Reporting officer went to the second floor apt. and talked with Amy Shea-16 yrs and she stated that her Mother is away again for a while and she is staying with her two sisters -Paula 13yrs. Nancy-15 yrs. and her Brother Tommy who is 10 yr.

Amy states that her Brother Tommy had some Jewelry in his hands this afternoon but she believed it was costume Jewelry. Tommy was not home at this time and Amy states that she will talk to him and then call the station. Also in the second floor apt. this date was the boyfriend to Amy, - Robert M. Loonie-19 yrs. of 71 Church St. Amy states that Loonie was not in the home for long.

Reporting Officer and Det. Skinner went <sup>to the</sup> Frank home at 88 Brook rd.

and had conversation with Tommy Shay - 10 yrs. Tommy has been spending time in different homes in the neighborhood since his Mother walked out on the family.

Tommy was asked about the Jewelry that was taken from the Rogers Apt. on 01-13-82. Tommy stated that he found the Jewelry on his sisters (Paula) bureau and Robert M. Loonie-18 yrs. -196 Fairmount St. Hy.Pk. took the Jewelry and stated " I'll take care of this". Robert Loonie is the boyfriend of Amy Shay and stays frequently at the Shay Apt.

01-17-82 - 1600 hrs.

Det. Skinner and reporting officer went to the Shay home to serve a CHINS warrant for Chauntelle Samuels and while at the home asked Robert Loonie to come to the station so we could talk to him. Loonie arrived at the station at 1700 hrs. with Amy Shay and Paula Shay . Loonie was given the Miranda Warnings and he states that Paula Shay- 13yrs. and Chauntelle Samuels broke into the first floor apt. ( Rogers) but did not want to get involved because he is still on probation from Plymouth County. Paula came upstairs and tells the following; On Wed. 01-13-82 she went downstairs (Rogers Apt.) and tried to force the rear door but was unable to make entrance this way ,so she forced a rear porch window. Paula states that Chauntelle entered the Apt. with her but took nothing. Paula believes that she took about fifteen rings from the Apt. and the expensive looking ones (about eight) she took into 44 Bromfield St. Boston (Gold&Silver second floor) and sold them for sixty dollars. Paula states that she needed the money for food in the house, but also admits that

portion of the money was left in the penny arcade machines. Paula states  
 that she used an I.D. with her older sisters picture and the name ~~Paula~~ <sup>Juanne</sup> Shay  
 and the owner of the Jewelry store (Gold&Silver) did not question her on her  
 age. Paula states that she thinks that more kids in Milton are dumping stolen  
 Jewelry there. Reporting officer will go to 44 Bronfield St. in the A.M. to  
 continue investigation. Paula Shay returned eight rings to Reporting officer and  
 Det. Skinner that she still had in her Apt. Rings are of less value than the ones  
 she sold at 44 Bronfield St. Receipt for rings signed for by Claire Rogers  
 and items turned over to her.

Reporting Officer and Det. Smyth went to Boston P.D. Headquarters and picked up Det. Paul Cahill from the Pawn Shop Detail. The three officers went to The Gold & Silver Jewelry Co. at 44 Bromfield St. Boston. Reporting Officer talked with the owner-Conrad K. Casarjian -DOB 12-10-43- and explained why we were there. Casarjian showed us the Pawn Book and on 01-13-82 it showed that Jeanne Shay had sold four rings to Casarjian for fifty dollars (total). The four rings were identified by me to have been property taken in a B&E

(Rogers) at 28 Belvoir Rd. A receipt for the stolen rings was given to Casarjian. ~~Seventeen~~ <sup>Five</sup> rings were seized by reporting officer. ~~sixteen~~ rings were taken in the B&E and twelve have now been recovered. The ~~four~~ missing rings are: 1. 10K Gold with Garnet Stone -2. 14K Gold with unknown Blue-Green Stone-3. 18K Gold with floral design with ruby on each petal and sapphire in middle. 4. 14K Gold large Black Onyx Ring with small Diamond. 5. Ladys Irish Claddagh Ring. Total value of rings still missing is \$1550.00. The above four recovered rings turned over to Claire Rogers and receipt made. Complaints will be taken out against Paula Shay-13 yrs. and Chauntelle Samuels -15 yrs. for B&E and larcany..
