PURPOSE: Interview (follow-up to 6-4-92 Session)

Following the handwriting session on June 4, Shay Jr. contacted AUSA Kelly and Agent Kerr by telephone and requested to speak with the agents at the U.S. Attorney's Office on June 11. Shay Jr. stated that Attorney McPhee no longer represented him.

On June 11, at his request, Shay Jr. was brought to the U.S. Attorney's Office. His counsel was notified and confirmed that he was "off the case." Shay Jr. was carefully informed of his rights by Agent D'Ambrosio. He then signed a written waiver of his fifth and sixth amendment rights.

For the next few hours, Agents D'Ambrosio and Kerr interviewed Shay Jr., during which time he denied that he was involved in the bombing and stated he felt that Bill Bayonne and Phil Smith of the South End were responsible. Shay Jr. claimed his father owed these guys money from gambling debts.

While some of the session was spent with Shay, Jr. acting foolish and appearing not to fully appreciate the seriousness of the interview, at most times, he was responsive and cooperative. Shay Jr. had with him several pages of handwritten notes which he read from, but refused to show the AUSA or agents. His notes were broken into the following topics, each of which he spent

time talking about:

1. Places he's been with Trenkler
2. People who have seen Trenkler and he together
3. Al Trenkler and money
4. Topics of conversation between he and Trenkler
 - a. sex
 - b. cute boys
 - c. family
 - d. electronics
 - e. Trenkler's work
5. How he feels about Trenkler
6. The last time he talked with Trenkler
7. His whereabouts the weekend prior to the bombing
8. Random thoughts
9. Things he wants the government to do for him.

Shay Jr. repeatedly asked if we could arrange to hypnotize him. When asked why, he said that he had heard that hypnosis allows certain repressed memories to come out, and that a person can not lie when under hypnosis. Shay Jr. was told that we would look into this and discuss it further when he had a new attorney to represent him.
