DETAILS (Continued)

Ms. Shay remembered back to the day the bombing occurred, October 28, 1991, and what she was doing. Ms. Shay, stated at the time, was working at" Everything Yogurt" in South Station. Her shift that day was 7am -3pm and she heard about the bomb from her brother Tommy. Tommy stopped to visit her at work and according to Ms. Shay, he appeared shocked at what had happened at their father's house. Tommy never told Ms. Shay what, if anything, he knew about the bombing. She described him as being shocked and also Ms. Shay stated she did not know if Tommy was with anyone or where he went the day of the bombing. Ms. Shay thinks that the two people from the gas station planted the bomb under her father's car because of the law suit brought against both of them.

Subsequent to the bombing Ms. Shay saw Tommy over their mother's house in Quincy she stated never relayed any information to her related to the bombing. Ms. Shay told her brother Tommy not to make any statements to the press about the bombing. She said that to Tommy because she knows how he seeks attention any way possible. Ms. Shay indicated that in early November 1991, Tommy was hanging around South Station with frequency. Tommy would visit Ms. Shay at "Everything Yogurt" from time to time but would never discuss much of anything with her. Ms. Shay reemphasized that she did not know who Tommy was hanging around with at the time of the bombing and shortly thereafter. However, Ms. Shay did indicate that she knew three of Tommy's friends. One being Randy Stoller, who owns a clothing store, and the other being Bill Macphee, who wrote Tommy letters and visited him in prison, and a third friend named Ralph (LNU). She stated she had met all of them but never had any significant discussions with them. Ms. Shay further stated that she never heard of John Cates or knew of him in any way. She knew of Al Trenkler only after his name was made public, but knew nothing personal of him or of his relationship with Tommy.

Ms. Shay described, according to her father, the events leading up to the bombing. She stated that her father found the bomb the night before, not knowing what it was, and kicked it against the side of the house. The next day his father went to see a friend at a body shop. The friend advised that the item (bomb) was not part of his vehicle. The father then went to the police station. The police responded with two bomb technicians to examine the item (bomb). The father and other officers at scene backed away from the bomb while the bomb technicians examined the device. Ms. Shay stated her father then heard what he described as tap tap - boom! Ms. Shay stated her father reacted in a totally shocked manner and has been living in fear ever since.
