PETITIONER ALFRED W. TRENKLER'S MOTION
FOR ENLARGEMENT OF TIME TO FILE REPLY BRIEF
RUNNING FROM THE SERVICE OF APPELLEE'S BRIEF

Petitioner Alfred W. Trenkler moves for an enlargement of time within which to file his reply brief running from the service of the appellee's brief, from 14 days to 28 days. As grounds for this motion, Mr Trenkler states as follows:

1. Due to the delays at the Devens Medical Center mailroom, Legal mail is delivered to inmates anywhere from 1 (one) to 2 (two) weeks after the U.S. mail service delivers mail to this facility and on occasion is never delivered to inmates.

2. Inquiries with the mail room reveal that this is common practice since no other reason is given for the severe delay of legal mail.

3. Due to this delay, Appellant Trenkler would have no way to receive the appellee's brief and respond within the two weeks as per Fed. R. P. 31 and 1st Cir R. 31.0.

Wherefore, appellant Trenkler respectfully requests that the schedule for filing his reply brief be enlarged from two weeks to four weeks to account for the anticipated delay caused

by the prison mailroom.
