TRANSLATION OF POLICE INCIDENT REPORT DATED 9/1/86 By Reporting Officer Peter Blank, Badge No. 133

On the above date at approximately 2:06 A.M. while assigned to the A-1 car, Officer Barnes and I received a call to go to the above address on a call of an explosion. Officers Gibbons and Dowling were at a call at 7-11 Copeland and stated that the explosion caused the building to shake.

Upon arrival we observed what appeared to be the remains of a bomb which had gone off under a truck owned by the above-named victim. Mass. Reg. A60494 1983 Ford F350-(box trunk) (Capeway Fish Market written on sides) no visible damage to truck. Identifiable objects from bomb - 4-AA batteries - one small toggle switch - small gauge wire, piece of heavy steel covered with duct tape believed to of been the cover (steel cap blank out to be magnet).

The victim states that he has been having trouble with a John and Donna Shea from 427 Lake Street, Weymouth. A little over a week ago the victim's tires on his truck were slashed, believed to of been done by the Sheas. The victim's wife stated that a party named David Noonan of Lake Street, Weymouth usually does the dirty work for the Sheas. Mr. Wojtasinski states that the Sheas are cocaine dealers and that they do not hold ordinary jobs. Last night the victim received a call from the Shea stating that he was, dead and his kids would also be dead. The victim states that he has made several complaints to the Weymouth PD regarding the Sheas. The victim states that this all started because the Shea's M/V tires were slashed and they believed that Mr. Wojtasinski did it.

Something peculiar about this is that the victim seems to know an awfully lot about the bomb, type in what it was made from. The deputy of the fire department feels that the victim may have done it himself. Captain Pell was on-scene along with Leo Voit from the State Police. Mr. Voit took all the remains of the bomb with him. Mr. Voit states that the explosion was an artillery simulator often used by the National Guard. He does not know what the batteries and other articles were used for since the simulator has a pin like a grenade and no need for wires or batteries has five to ten second delay once pulled.

Donna Shea was a past employee of the victim's. She was fired for dealing cocaine over the counter. Mr. Wojtasinski has a restraining order against her. ______ PD has a copy. The phones at the Capeway Market are being tapped 335-438_ plus 335-4383.
