Sir,

At about 1:00pm Monday, 10/28/91 I arrived at 39 Eastbourne St. with Dave Kitchens of the video unit to video the scene of a bomb detonation with officer injured. While at the scene I had occasion to enter the house to place a call. While I was in the kitchen one Mary Flanagan came in and appeared upset. I asked if I could help and she said she didn't know what to do. I asked if she had children and suggested she make arrangements for her daughter for after school. She did and asked if I could help.

I stayed in the kitchen with her and during conversation she expressed concern over what happened. I asked if she had any idea who would do this. Mary said she wasn't sure and wouldn't want to say, but she felt sure that Tom knew who did it and we should ask him. She also said that Tom had been paranoid about something and that he had been getting worse.

I stayed with Mary while she was interviewed by Dets. Richie Ross and Bill Fogerty. When they were finished she and I spoke in the parlor and I asked if she would tell us if she knew. She said she would have to ask Tom. I asked if he told her would she tell us. She said, "What if he told me not too?"

Mary agreed to talk to Tom about the incident and asked if I could come back tomorrow to talk with her.
