9. DETAILS:

On 10/28/91 an explosive device detonated at 39 Eastbourne Street, Roslindale, Massachusetts. As a result of the explosion a Boston Police Bomb Technician was killed and a second seriously injured.

On the same date the ATF NRT Northeast team was activated and responded to Roslindale, Massachusetts. On 10/29/91 the NRT with the assistance of the Boston Police Department and the Massachusetts State Police processed the scene for evidence of the device. A total of 45 exhibits were recovered at the scene and during subsequent investigation.

Previous to this transmittal, approximately 45 exhibits, number 1-45 were forwarded to the lab for analysis.

On or about 11/5/91 Alfred Trenkler, a primary suspect in this investigation was interviewed and agreed to a consent search of the residence he was currently residing at, 133 Atlantic Street, Quincy, Massachusetts, the garage of his parents residence, 7 WhiteLawn, Milton, Massachusetts, his vehicle, a 1970 Toyota Celica and his place of business, ARCOMM, 88 Broad Street, Weymouth, Massachusetts. Recovered at 88 Broad Street, Weymouth, Massachusetts were the following exhibits, 46, 47A-G and 49A-C. Recovered from a 1970 Toyota Celica, owned by Trenkler was exhibit 55, and recovered from the garage of 7 WhiteLawn, Milton, Massachusetts were exhibits 48A, B, 50, 51, 52, 53, 54, 56, 57, 58 and 59.

This letter is to transmit exhibits 46 through 59 to the lab and to request that all pertinent forensic analysis be conducted. Lab analyst Cynthia Wallace responded with the Northeast Team. Due to the sensitive nature of this investigation it is requested that the analysis of the
