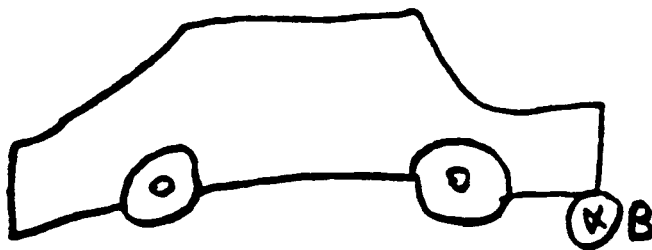

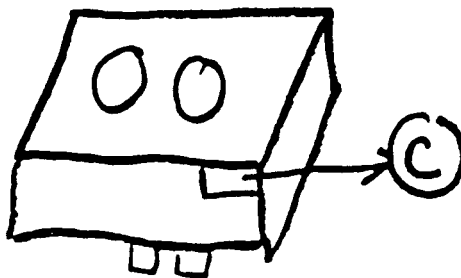
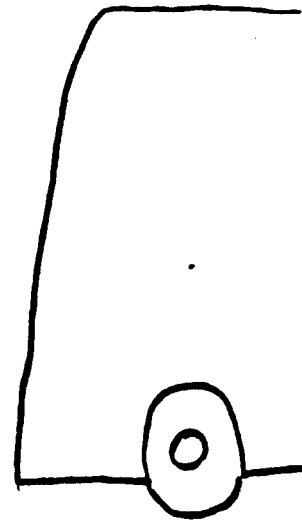
A- PLACE WHERE BOMB EXPLODED

firecracker was placed into and exploded and that Shay stated that it was an M 80 and that there was a lawsuit for something like \$1500 or \$15,000. Shay talked to Foley about magnets but Foley did not understand what he was talking about.

Foley then returned to the location between the two vehicles and had his back facing the fence and Hurley was to his right by the bomb. Hurley said to Foley that at the corner of the item it looked like a arming switch and Foley bent over to see and said to Hurley that it looks like a Servo (which Foley indicated was it the far right hand corner) and is moving. Within five seconds the bomb exploded. Prior to the bomb exploding Foley could not recall any sound similar to a snap, pop, click or see any kind of light beam either red or green. Foley stated was not touching the item when it exploded.

Foley stated that Hurley was the tech that day and Foley was the observer, note reporter and was a few feet away from Hurley at the time of the explosion. Foley stated that he remained conscious the hole time and that there was a white smoke and a small fire ball. Foley stated that Hurley never mentioned the presence of a wire. Foley stated that they were still evaluating the situation as to whether to call for the big bomb truck. Foley stated that neither he or Hurley used any tools on the item. Stated that they had a portable X ray machine in the truck.

In this report Shay's name is used as the writers way on indicating 'he' in regard to Foley's explanation.
