

REPORT OF INTERVIEW

With Scott D. Critcher, on
on November 15, 1991 at 223
Center Street, Quincy, MA
by Special Agent Henry J.
Moniz, Jr., Bureau of Alcohol,
Tobacco & Firearms and Det.
Miller Johnson, Boston Police
Homicide Unit. Mr. Critcher
states as follows:

Mr. Critcher said that he is employed as
a clerk for the Store 24, 230 Washington Street, Quincy,
Massachusetts (617-773-3839), DOB: 06-09-55, SS# 014-
44-0588, home telephone #617-471-6156. And he works
there from four PM to midnight.

Mr. Critcher stated that he first met Thomas Shay,
Jr., the week of 10-20-91 at his place of employment,
Store 24, Washington St., Quincy. Mr. Critcher said
that Washington Street in Quincy, in the vicinity of
his place of employment, is a cruising area for gays to
meet. Shay, Jr., heard about Mr. Critcher and wanted
to meet him because, "He (Critcher) was a cool guy."
Mr. said in his initial conversation with Shay, Jr., he
found him to be a little young for him but he
(Shay, Jr.) appeared to know everyone in the Washington
Street area.

Mr. Critcher said Shay, Jr., gave his mother's
address and telephone number to contact him. And that
he (Shay, Jr.,) lived there with his mother and sisters
which he said was a hassal. He noticed Shay, Jr., wore
a beeper which he claimed he was on call for the Red
Cross.

Mr. Critcher said Shay, Jr., was nicknamed "WEIRD
TOM" in the Washington Street area. He believed Shay,
Jr., was gay because he was always making sexual
comments and grabbing himself (genitals area). And that
Shay, Jr., believed that everyone wanted him sexually.

On October 26, 1991 he (Critcher) hosted a party
at his house, 223 Center St., Quincy. Approximately
thirty (30) people, both gays and straights to include
Shay, Jr. Mr. Critcher said that Shay, Jr., and he
just talked at the party and nothing else occurred.

The last time he saw Shay, Jr., was on the evening of 10-27-91 at his (Critcher) place of employment, Store 4, Washington St., Quincy. Shay, Jr., stayed with him until 2 AM after which he walked him home. Mr. Critcher said Shay, Jr., did not stay the night nor did anything happen.

He first learned of the bombing incident and Shay, Jr., involvement

He spoke to Shay, Jr.'s mother sometime during the first week of November, 1991 because he had sent Shay, Jr., a birthday card to her house. It was then he learned of the requirements to visit Shay, Jr., in jail. He has since wrote to Shay, Jr., who is now in jail.
