REPORT OF INTERVIEW

With Steven Winslow, on November 26, 1991, at 4:00 P.M., at Parkway Towing, 8 Willow Street, West Roxbury, Massachusetts, Tel. No. 617 364-2900 by Special Agent Wayne Miller and Special Agent Jeff S. Kerr, Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms. Mr. Winslow stated as follows:

Mr. Winslow stated that his DOB is 8/16/59. He stated that his father is the owner of Parkway Towing. He stated that on October 28, 1991 he dispatched Richard Kaczynski to 39 Eastbourne Street, Roslindale, Massachusetts when he received a request from the Boston Police Department for a ramp tow truck.

Winslow stated that he later went to the same residence when the Boston Police Department called to request a second vehicle be towed. Winslow stated that he remained at the site for approximately 20-30 minutes and that he was never instructed to tow a second vehicle. He stated that there was no information relayed to him or the tow company when the police called for assistance. He stated that at the time he received the call he did not know who resided at the residence, (39 Eastbourne St.) but that he did learn that one Thomas Shay resided there when the news stations began to broadcast the particulars of the incident.

Winslow stated that he knows Thomas Shay from towing cars for the Dedham Service Center where Shay at one time leased work space. He also stated that he has known Dedham Service Center owners, Jeffrey Berry and Louis Giammarco for approximately six (6) years. He stated that he is friendly with both men. He stated that he had on at least one occasion spoken with

Louis Giammarco about Thomas Shay and the bombing. He stated that he was aware of a law suit which had been filed by Shay against Giammarco and Berry. He stated that he was aware that Shay had left the Dedham Service Center building because of escalated rent imposed by Giammarco and Berry.

Winslow stated that he at some time telephoned Giammarco to joke about Shay and the bombing at Shay's residence because he knew of the adversarial relationship between the parties. He stated that he did not recall what Giammarco had to say relative to that particular telephone conversation.
