REPORT OF INTERVIEW

With Alfred W. Trenkler, on November 6, 1991, at 133 Atlantic Avenue, Quincy, Massachusetts and at 82 Broad Street, Weymouth, Massachusetts, by Boston Police Detective, Homicide Unit, Peter J. O'Malley, Special Agent Thomas D'Ambrosio and Special Agent Dennis Leahy, Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms, Boston Field Division. Mr. Trenkler states as follows:

Mr. Trenkler said that he resides at 133 Atlantic Ave., Quincy with his gay lover John Alan Cates and has lived there with Cates for approximately eight months. Mr. Trenkler and Mr. Cates allowed a consent search of this apartment in the basement of 133 Atlantic street. Observed in the apartment was an exposed speaker with speaker magnet attached on a shelf near the kitchen. The speaker was not attached to a stereo, television or other electronic device. Also observed was a book on "Dirty Tricks" containing information on how to get even with people. Mr. Trenkler was noticeably shaken and asked how we located him. Mr. Trenkler agreed to a consent search at his business ARCOMM Inc., located at 82 Broad St., Weymouth, Massachusetts. Mr. Trenkler said that he had nothing to hide and also agreed to accompany us to ARCOMM Inc.

On November 6, 1991, Det. O'Malley and Special Agent's D'Ambrosio and Leahy along with Mr. Trenkler proceed to ARCOMM Inc. Upon arrival at ARCOMM Mr. Trenkler produced keys and opened the door to ARCOMM. Mr. Trenkler again said that he had nothing to hide and would allow a consent

search of his business. Mr. Trenkler admitted building a remote control bomb in 1986 for John and Donna Shea and placing the bomb on a truck in Quincy, Massachusetts. Mr. Trenkler admitted that he was arrested by Quincy Police and that he confessed to the Quincy Police that he had build the bomb.

Mr. Trenkler said that he had an electronics background and had been employed by several companies in the electronics field. Mr. Trenkler said that ARCOMM installs microwave dishes and towers and installs cellular phones in cars as well as leasing/renting pagers to the public. Mr. Trenkler gave consent to have several of his tools examined at the ATF National Lab. Mr. Trenkler also gave consent for several of his records/sales slips etc. to be taken for examination.

Mr. Trenkler also discussed his construction and building procedures of the bomb that he was arrested for in Quincy in detail to include drawing a diagram of the internal components and electrical wiring system. Mr. Trenkler also when asked how he would build and wire the internal components of the bomb that had killed Boston Police Officer Jerry Hurley drew a diagram of an electrical circuit with a electrical detonator (blasting cap) to each stick of dynamite; showing two sticks of dynamite and two electrical detonators in the bomb.

Mr. Trenkler said that he had all the tools to build a bomb at ARCOMM as he was in the communications business. Mr. Trenkler said that he knew Thomas A. Shay and had given him a ride several times and approximately four times had stopped by 133 Atlantic Ave., Quincy with Thomas A. Shay, but that Shay had never been inside his and Cates apartment. Trenkler said that he was gay and that he had met Thomas A. Shay at or near a White Hen located on Boylston Street, Boston, Massachusetts. Trenkler said that this area next to the Fenway and that the "Ramrod" gay bar is a common area for gays to meet. Trenkler said that he gave Thomas A. Shay his business card.

Mr. Trenkler said that he stored his equipment at a garage located next to his mothers house, at 7 Whitelawn Ave., Milton, Massachusetts. Mr. Trenkler also stated that he would give consent to have ATF search this garage.

Mr. Trenkler then was driven to 7 Whitelawn Ave., Milton, Massachusetts where he produced a ring of keys opened the garage door and said that he would again give consent to search the garage. Mr. Trenkler said that the right side of the garage was where he stored his electronic equipment and that his brother and he both stored things on the other side of the garage. Trenkler also said that he had a room in his mothers house where he kept his clothing. Trenkler asked to be driven back to Quincy and was.
