Mr. Stoller stated that approximately two (2) years ago he was at an overlook area in Blue Hills Park in Boston when Thomas Shay, Jr., approached him and asked if he would help him jump start his (Shay, Jr.'s) car. Shay, Jr. directed Stoller to a faded dark green Chevrolet Impala (not really sure make of car). After about twenty (20) minutes they got Shay, Jr.'s car started. A conversation ensued and subsequently developed into a friendship.

Mr. Stoller initial impression of Shay, Jr. was that of a problem kid and place his mental age around ten to thirteen years old. Mr. Stoller stated that he is bisexual and has not had sex, of any kind, with Shay, Jr. Nor has Shay, Jr. approached him for sex. He knows Shay, Jr. to be homosexual

and the only boy in the Shay family. He has met Shay, Jr.'s mother and been to her home in Quincy. He also knows Shay, Jr. to exaggerate when talking to people.

At the onset of their relationship they went to diner a couple of times and to the movies. Mr. Stoller said he knew that Shay, Jr. had gone to California, Seattel, Washington and Van Couver, Canada during the course of their relationship. While away Shay, Jr., would telephone Mr. Stoller, usually collect, or call from a friend's house he (Shay, Jr) was staying with. Sometimes a few months would past without any contact from Shay, Jr. at all. Mr. Stoller said he has never heard or known Shay, Jr. talk bad about anyone including his (Shay, Jr.) father. And that he has never seen Shay, Jr mad.

Mr. Stoller was not sure of the exact date but either October 28, or 29, 1991 but he was certain it was after the detonation of the bomb he received a telephone call (not collect) from Shay, Jr. Shay, Jr. asked if Mr. Stoller hear what happened in Roslindale. Shay, Jr. told Mr. Stoller that it was his father's house where the detonation took place. Mr. Stoller described Shay, Jr.'s voice as being excited. Further inquiry as to Shay, Jr.'s excitment Mr. Stoller said he (Shay, Jr.) seemed fearful. Mr. Stoller than said that he doubted what Shay, Jr. was saying and, "Just blew it off."

Their conversation continued with Shay, Jr., telling his mother's lawyer told them they should not stay at their Quincy home. As a result Shay, Jr. asked Mr. Stoller for a ride. Mr. Stoller agreed and picked Shay, Jr. up at his (Shay, Jr.'s) mother's house in Quincy. Mr. Stoller brought Shay, Jr. to Providence, Rhode Island. Mr. Stoller dropped Shay, Jr. off in Providence on Empire Street between the Providence public library and the Trinity Theater. He had dropped Shay, Jr. there before and observed Shay, Jr. go to the adult book store across the street from the theater. (Book store over Sabastian's)

Approximately one week later Mr. Stoller received a telephone call from Shay, Jr. Shay, Jr. told Mr. Stoller that the police believed he (Shay, Jr.) was involved in the making of the bomb. To himself, Mr. Stoller did and does not believe that Shay, Jr.'s has the mental capacity, ability or technology to be able to construct a bomb. Since the detonation Shay, Jr. has contacted him telephonically on three (3) occasions, none of which were collect calls.

Shay, Jr. also told Mr. Stoller that his father (Shay, Sr) was involved in a legal case that happened a few years prior in Dedham, Mass. At the time his father owned an auto body business and brought suit against the owner of the building where his father's shop was located.

Mr. Stoller stated that during the course of his relationship with Shay, Jr. he has loaned him, on three or four occasions, money totaling \$500.00 to \$600.00. To date he has only received \$50.00.

When asked for his telephone billing records Mr. Stoller provided the bills pertaining to him company telephone. He stated that only received one telephone from Shay, Jr. at his (Stoller's) residence but was not there at the time. He stated that his parents were not aware of the Roslindale situation and to be contacted at his place of employment/business.

There were two vehicles parked in Saltzman's parking spaces at the rear of the store. Massachusetts registration 667-FFH, a new grey, two door Pontiac, Grand Prix and an older white with a black top four door AMC, Rhode Island registration TT-835.

Mr. Stoller stated that he was previously interviewed by the Boston Police Detectives and would be available should there be a need for further interview.
