Dear Mr. McPhee:

Please be advised that your client, Thomas A. Shay, contacted me twice by telephone last week; once on April 15 and once on April 16. On both occasions I informed Mr. Shay that it was unwise for him to be calling me, and I asked him no substantive questions. Mr. Shay stated that he understood his rights and further understood that anything he said to me could be used against him. He also asked me not to tell you that he had called. He stated that he was unhappy with you since you were no longer taking his calls.

For your information, both telephone calls were very brief, lasting only a few minutes. Mr. Shay did not incriminate himself during either call, or make any statements which I consider as having any evidentiary value. During the first call, he read me a short letter (which he had apparently written to me) in which he claimed that his father was responsible for the Roslindale bombing that killed Officer Hurley. During the second call he read me a letter which he has written to his father, blaming him for the bombing.

Please inform Mr. Shay that I will not be taking any more of his telephone calls. I would, however, be interested in meeting with you sometime this week to discuss Mr. Shay's situation. Please call me when your schedule permits.
