Dear Counsel:


Please be advised that the United States Attorney has decided not to seek the death penalty in the above-referenced action, even though the same is listed as sentencing option for persons convicted under 18 U.S.C. §§844(d) and 844(i) in cases involving the death of a public safety officer.

If convicted after trial of the charges contained in Counts Two and Four of the indictment, the government intends to seek a mandatory term of life imprisonment for each defendant. This sentence is authorized by the applicable statutes, and appears to be required by Sections 2A1.1, 2K1.3(c)(1)(B) and 2K1.4(c)(1) of the Federal Sentencing Guidelines, since the crime here involved a deliberate and premeditated design to kill another human being.


