DEFENDANT'S MOTION TO SUPPRESS EVIDENCE SEIZED WITHOUT A WARRANT ON NOVEMBER 5-6, 1991

Now comes the Defendant, Alfred Trenkler, and moves this Court to suppress from use in evidence any and all evidence seized or derived from the warrantless searches executed on or about November 5-6, 1991 of the Defendant's 1970 Toyota Celica; his residence, located at 133 Atlantic Street, Quincy; his place of business, located at 82 Broad Street, Weymouth; and a garage located at 7 Whitelawn Avenue, Milton; all areas as to which the Defendant enjoyed a reasonable expectation of privacy.

As grounds therefore, the Defendant says all such evidence was seized:

- a) without the benefit of a lawful search warrant;
- b) in the absence of probable cause;

- while not in plain view from a vantage C) point which law enforcement agents had a lawful right to occupy; and
- in the absence of a valid consent; d) all in violation of the Fourth Amendment to the United States Constitution.
